

FIRST AID

- Teams must provide their own medical supplies and do their own taping. A Student First Responder or EMT member will be onsite at all times.

TEAM AND GAME PHOTOS

Each team will have high-quality action shots taken of them throughout the tournament and will be given a chance to purchase using a QR code at the conclusion of the event.

AWARDS PRESENTATIONS

- The Team Sportsmanship Award will be presented by the ASAA to the recipient school at a time shortly after the competition.

DRAW

- The participating teams in the tournament will be ranked/seeded by the ASAA.
- The tournament organizers have no control over seeding the tournament draw.
- The final draw with team names allocated with their appropriate seeds will be posted on the website by Tuesday March 14th.
- Game results and score sheets will be posted on the Tournament website throughout the tournament.

CHANGE ROOMS

- 4 Team rooms will be used throughout our tournament. Teams will have access to these rooms 45 min prior to game time and 45 min after their game. Please ensure these rooms are kept clean for the next user. Team hosts will have access to keys for these rooms.
- DO NOT leave valuables in the change rooms. Glenmary School is not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

GAME TIME PROCEDURES

- Remain off the court until teams have vacated their bench with their belongings.
- Dunking, without excessive hanging on the rim, will be allowed in warm up.
- Identify the starters on the score sheet so they can be introduced prior to the start of their first game and for the medal games.
- Games will not begin prior to the scheduled start time.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- The Sportsmanship Committee will be comprised of members of the Organizing Committee as well as a representative voice from the ABOA.
- The Sportsmanship Committee will award individual pins in recognition of sportsmanship-like actions through the tournament.
- They will forward a recommendation for the Team Award to the ASAA for later presentation.

DISCIPLINE & MISCONDUCT

- Breaches of the ASAA Code of Ethics are treated seriously and, as hosts, we are required to immediately report to the ASAA office any breaches that come to our attention. A portion of the ASAA Code of Ethics states “Any conduct, including, but not limited to ejections, fighting, drugs and alcohol use, that results in dishonor to the athlete, the team, the school or the ASAA will not be tolerated.”
- Coaches who have been ejected from a game will be required to leave the school premises for the duration of that match and cannot re-enter the building until 30 minutes after the match. The coach is suspended from the subsequent match as well.
- Athletes who have been ejected from a game are required to leave the gym, and are suspended from the next match too.

GRIEVANCE/DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE

- A Grievance/Discipline Committee will be in place to review any and all concerns that may occur. These will include appeals of application of ASAA policy (e.g. automatic game suspension for ejection of an athlete or coach), as well as tournament concerns.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- We remind all about the standards of behavior and performance for which the ASAA stands – applying the team’s members as well as supporters. Fair play and sportsmanship of team members are expectations of the ASAA and the Organizing Committee, and the responsibility of coaches.
- While hosts will monitor and address unacceptable spectator behavior, we will – if necessary – call on team delegates to assist with their fans.
- A reminder that artificial noisemakers are not allowed at ASAA events.
- If a coach is disqualified and will receive a one game suspension the team will require another teacher sponsor to be with the team. If no teacher sponsor is available for that team, the team will not be allowed to participate in their following game.

Emergency Action Plan

Glenmary School 8801-96 Street, Peace River, AB, 780-624-5656

- 1) AED is located at the main entry to the Glenmary gymnasium near the water fountain (NW corner). First aid kit and ice available in the PE office and from Student First Responders.
- 2) Landline located in PE office. Cell phone will be available from tournament chair.
- 3) For ambulance, please call 9-1-1. In case of ambulance, please direct to the East entrance of our gym doors and ensure no vehicles are in the way.

When an Injury occurs:

- 1) Take control of the situation. Exercise universal precautions related to blood/body fluids.
- 2) Do not move the student if they cannot do so on their own. Do not remove any part of their uniform unless deemed necessary.
- 3) Assess and evaluate the severity of the situation and decide if further assistance is required.
- 4) If an ambulance is required, then determine the action required to remove the athlete from the playing surface.
- 5) If an ambulance is called, direct one person to collect and give the pertinent information to them. Include location, and extent of the injury. Ask this person to report back with ETA.
- 6) Have one person remain with injured student and address any concerns they have while awaiting medical attention.
- 7) Ensure another person directs an ambulance to the East gym entrance as this is the quickest and most direct route to remove student from the gym.
- 8) Do not give food or drink to an injured athlete unless required because of existing medical conditions (i.e. Diabetes).
- 9) Remain calm and reassuring to injured athlete.
- 10) Once the ambulance arrives, have the person who collected all the information concerning the injured student, share this with medical personnel.
- 11) Designate an adult from that team to accompany the injured athlete to the hospital.
- 12) Parents/guardians of the injured athlete should be contacted as soon as possible following the injury.
- 13) Complete the attached incident/accident report form and return it to the tournament organizer/administration.

Protocol in Event of an Emergency

- 1) Call ambulance or Fire Department, 9-1-1
- 2) Address to the school is 8801-96 street. Tell emergency services to come to the East entrance of the gym near the track oval and somebody will be there to direct them.
- 3) Indicate the location and nature of the injury.
- 4) Report to coach/Administrator.
- 5) Have one person meet ambulance.
- 6) See map below of route to the hospital from Glenmary.
