Registration Information

Tournament fees for the 3A Championships have been established by the ASAA at \$520 per team. The fee is based solely on ABOA costs. Teams will register for the tournament through the official host website the week prior. Additionally, there is a "Pay it Forward Loonie Fee" assessed at \$1/participating student that is remitted back to ASAA that will be directed to a scholarship fund. This fee will be added to the registration. Payment can be made via cheque on check-in, or over the phone with a credit card or email transfer. Banquet fees will also be paid at this time at \$35/ticket.

Required Items:

-
- Team Roster – player name, number, height, position, grade
 - Team Picture – a 5x7 team photo of high resolution for printing in the program. This would be a minimum of 2100 by 1500 pixels.
 - School Logo – If possible send the school logo as a transparent vector file. Alternatively, a transparent image with a minimum of 300 x 300 pixels would suffice. (The larger the better).
 - Team history/season summary (brief).

Photos

The ASAA asks that all teams complete a photo for the yearbook. Photos will be taken at the Wetaskiwin Composite High School on Wednesday, March 15th during registration. Teams are asked to be dressed in uniforms for the pictures with player numbers visible.

Photo times can be requested by signing up on the website. Time preferences will be managed against the travel of teams. Check-in can be completed at the photo time slot. Drop-in times will be allowed on a first-come, first-served basis with priority given to those who have booked a time slot.

Each team will be provided one 8x10 team photo. Extra photos may be purchased. These orders are to be indicated on the registration forms.

Please note team photos will be done after completed check-in and finalization of registration. Final payments should be made no later than this time.

Practice

There will be an hour blocked off for practice times. Please ensure you exit before the next team's practice. There will be available practice time on Wednesday, March 15th from 9am-4pm. Please sign up through the website to secure your time.

Banquet

The banquet will be March 15th, from 6-8pm, at the Wetaskiwin Composite High School Gymnasium. Attendance at the banquet is compulsory for all coaches and team members.

Dress is semi-formal and fees will be \$35/person. There is a maximum of 18 tickets allowed per team unless a formal request is made for additional tickets. Requests can be made to wood.chelseya@gmail.com. Tickets must be paid at time of registration. The banquet will include a short program and full meal.

Coaches Meeting/Captains Meeting

Coaches and Captains meetings are mandatory. There will be simultaneous coaches and captains meetings on March 15th directly after the banquet at around 8:15pm. It will be

held in a directed classroom at the same location as the banquet. Please ensure your team has at least one representative at both mandatory meetings. Information regarding the provincial championships will be provided.

Opening Ceremony

The opening ceremony will take place Thursday, March 16th at 9am. **We ask that all teams arrive at WCHS at or before 8:30am.** Buses can drop students off at the back doors on the east side of the school. There will be a host to direct teams. Students will congregate inside the school until ceremonies begin, and each team has their intro. The ceremony will be approx 30 min. Games begin at 10:30. Please have teams dressed in matching apparel or uniforms. Inside shoes would be appreciated.

Tournament Apparel

Elite Promotional Marketing will be providing tournament apparel for players, coaches, and fans to purchase. There will be limited apparel for purchase in the front foyer from Thursday to Saturday. Team Orders can be submitted prior to, or during the tournament. Orders will be shipped directly to schools. Please see the website for further purchasing details.

Change Rooms

Wetaskiwin Composite High School will have change rooms available for team use. Please be advised that WCHS is NOT responsible for lost or stolen articles. Please ensure all items are safely stored. Change rooms can be used immediately prior to and following games. Again, personal items should NOT be left in the change rooms. Access to change rooms will not be granted until the completion of halftime of the previous game.

Coaches & Officials Room

WCHS is happy to host a hospitality room this year that will be available for our volunteers and coaches. Officials are also welcome to use this courtesy space. There will be a variety of snacks, foods and beverages provided at the schools in use from Thursday-Saturday.

Medical & First Aid

Although athletic assistance and supply is the direct responsibility of each individual team, first aid stations will be on location with additional supplies and access to ice. Teams should bring their own medical supplies and do their own taping, but we will have a certified first aid responder on-site at all times in case of emergencies and to assist in any minor injuries. Please ask if you are requiring assistance in this matter. If there is a major injury or incident, emergency services will be called.

Parking

Please be aware that all school gyms in use will have classes in session on Wednesday and Thursday. Please do not park in designated bus areas. There is ample parking for our spectators and teams in our student parking lot and overflow over by the civic centre/ice rinks. Please follow the parking guidelines below for each school:

WCHS - Bus parking by Curling Rink, 4520-48 Ave (east of school gym) Wednesday-Friday

Queen E - Bus parking in Sacred Heart Church (north of school gym) Wednesday, Friday and Saturday - Please use street parking Thursday evening, as there is a service scheduled

Clear Vista - Bus parking in bus loop (north side of school, furthest north end of loop)

Please abide by all other posted parking rules

School Rules

During Wednesday & Thursday competition, please be advised that classes will be in session during school hours and other events will be going on in the school. Please be courteous and respectful during this time and for the duration of the tournament. Please be sure to only use your gym footwear and practice balls when in the gymnasium(s). Absolutely no warming up or playing with balls outside of the gymnasiums.

No Smoking Policy

All facilities are smoke-free (& Vape Free) facilities. Smoking by athletes, parents, and spectators is prohibited anywhere at Wetaskiwin Composite High School, Queen Elizabeth or Clear Vista.

Sportsmanship Pin Award

Consistent with the ASAA values, a strong emphasis on and recognition of sportsmanship in both individual and teams will be highlighted. The Sportsmanship Committee will award individual pins in recognition of sportsmanship-like actions throughout the tournament, and will forward recommendation for the Team Award to the ASAA for later presentation.

Fair Play and Sportsmanship

All competitions must be conducted with a high standard of courtesy, fair play and sportsmanship. All those involved share this responsibility.

We remind all about the standard of behaviour and performance for which the ASAA stands - applying to coaches, teams and supporters. Fair play and sportsmanship of team members are expectations of the ASAA and the Organizing Committee, and the responsibility of coaches. A reminder that artificial noisemakers are not allowed at ASAA events. While hosts will monitor and address unacceptable spectator behaviour, we will - if necessary - call on team delegates to assist with their fans.

A reminder that a coach or player who is disqualified will receive a one-game suspension. If it is a teacher sponsor that is disqualified, and no other teacher sponsor is available for that team, the team will not be allowed to participate in the following game.

Awards Ceremony


Awards ceremonies will occur immediately following each medal game on the main court at Wetaskiwin Composite High School. Participating teams are asked to line up after the team handshakes.





