
Sportsmanship

Expectations of Fans


- Game attendance is a privilege, not a license to verbally assault others or to be obnoxious.
- Respect decisions made by contest officials.
- Be an exemplary role model by positively supporting teams in every manner possible, including content of cheers and signs.
- Become aware of the purpose and rules of the ASAA to keep winning in its proper place.
- Respect fans, coaches and participants. Be a fan, not a fanatic!!
- Recognize outstanding performances on either side of the playing field.

Positive Behaviour

- Applaud during introduction of players, coaches and officials.
- Accept all decisions by officials.
- Shake hands with opponents at the end of the game, regardless of the outcome.
- Treat competition as a game, not a war.
- Search out opposing participants to recognize them for outstanding performance or coaching.
- Applaud at the end of the contest for performances of all participants.
- Demonstrate concern for injured players, regardless of team.
- Encourage displays of sportsmanlike conduct.

Unacceptable Behaviour

- Yelling or negative chanting or gestures towards opponent.
- Booing or heckling an officials' decision.
- Criticizing officials in any way; displays of temper with an official's call.
- · Taunting or "trash talking".
- Refusing to shake hands or to give recognition for good performances.
- Blaming loss of game on officials, coaches or participants.
- Laughing or name calling to distract opponent.
- Using profanity or displays of anger that draw attention away from the game.


South Zone
