

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

Well, it has been two years since an ASAA Championship in Volleyball was held and it is very exciting for me to be welcoming students and coaches back to school sport on behalf of the ASAA.

I have never taken school athletics for granted – it has been a passion for me since I was a high school student, then later a high school coach and for many years now, a high school athletics administrator. What I did learn over the past 20 months since the pandemic started was that the passion students, coaches and parents/guardians have for school sport is alive and well.

Whilst we lost many school athletic opportunities during the pandemic, the reports I have received in the fall of 2021 point to an increased interest in school athletics from both an athlete and a spectator perspective.

Studies have shown that the levels of anxiety and depression in student athletes increased significantly as a result of losing school sport, and I trust we will see much more positive mental health in our student athletes resulting from a return to school sport. While we must remain vigilant in the ways we reduce the potential for communicable disease spread in school

sports, we must be grateful for the opportunities that now present themselves for students to participate in as safe a setting as is possible given the modifications being applied at this event.

I wish to thank the championship hosts Travis Eggink, Miriam Doef, and Veronica Den Oudsten and all the students and volunteers at Central Alberta Christian High School for their positive approach to this 1A Girls Volleyball ASAA Championship and for doing all they can to ensure a safe and enjoyable event for all student athletes, coaches and spectators attending. We cannot run our championships without these outstanding volunteers.




The Case for Sportsmanship**





We also ranked first in League out of 7 teams.






